

20 Answers to Questions to test your Map Reading Knowledge, Level 1

O.S. Explorer OL45 "The Cotswolds", South Sheet

1. The farm in this grid square is Dudley Farm.
2. It's in the South part of the square.

3. The lane is Hay Lane.
4. It's a Bridleway.
5. Walkers, cyclists and horseriders are entitled to use bridleways.

6. A name in Gothic font indicates an Historic (but not Roman) building (or feature).
7. Green lozenges indicate a named recreational route (usually a long walking trail).
8. The track goes uphill out of Turkdean.

9. Blue symbols indicate Tourist and Leisure information or feature.
10. This one is a National Trust property.

11. It's a carpark at or near paths or trails that can be walked.

12. It's Access land – crops etc permitting, you can walk anywhere here.
13. The footpath runs (roughly) Northeast – Southwest.

14. Black arrowheads indicate a steep gradient. (The arrowhead always points downhill).
15. The nearest village is Compton Abdale.
16. No, it's not a hilltop village, it's in a valley.
17. A Church (with a tower) is marked in Compton Abdale.

18. In this village, a Church (with a tower), a school and a public house are marked (also a telephone kiosk, though BT may have removed it since the map was last updated)
19. Following the footpath South from the village towards a walkers carpark takes you downhill to begin with.
20. From the PRoW junction near the stream to the lane near the carpark is 1400 metres, or 1.4 kms.
