Chavenage Estate Level 1-2 POR Training Ride, Sunday 30 April 2023

The Old Dairy or Cranmore Dairy, (as per the OS map), Chavenage Estate, Tetbury, Glos, GL8 8XU

This will be a gentle ride of 15 km on Bridleways, Byways, across farmland, through woods and some quiet roads, along a variety of surfaces, including a short stony section. This is suitable for anyone wishing to dust off their map case and get ready for the summer season.

The meeting place is a group of barns and a warehouse with hard standing for parking. The venue is 2 miles off the A46 along a single-track road with passing places, or take the Avening road out of Tetbury and follow signs for Chavenage.

You will be given a pre-drawn map, unless you would prefer to draw your own, please indicate on the entry form.

You can ride as a pair or individual. You must be a member of Wessex Trec or belong to another Trec club

There will be a portable toilet at the venue, and snack catering – tea/coffee and biscuits/cake.

Riders will be given a start time and should aim to arrive at the venue about 30 minutes before this time.

They should present by that start time for Tack Check.

They will then be given their marked route map (unless they have chosen to mark their own), and a POR record card.

There will be set speeds to try to achieve between Checkpoints.

On completion of the ride and return to the venue, riders will be able to check their performance against set timings.

Entries will close on 22 April 2023, or before that, if all places have been allocated.

Withdrawals up to this date will receive a full refund.

Start times will be sent by email by 27 April 2023.

Equine Flu Requirements: TREC GB requires that all events, including training, involving equines should insist that vaccinations are up to date (12-month cycle) and passports are checked before horses are unloaded. Horses that have had their annual vaccination or a booster, within the last six days of the event will not be allowed to take part.

Owners of unvaccinated horses should note that a new programme takes a minimum of 28 days.

1. The 12-month cycle means that a horse's vaccinations should be dated on or within 365 days (twelve months), for each year recorded on the passport, after the initial cycle of three injections were originally completed. For example, a horse vaccinated on 15th March one year needs to be vaccinated on or before 15th March the following year. This also applies in leap years.
2. Horses with several years of annual booster vaccinations can have gaps in their record provided that:
 - a) The first two primary injections were administered correctly before 1st January 2016. (2nd injection between 21-92 days after the 1st injection).
 - b) All annual boosters since 1st January 2016 are within time.

Your horse can be registered on the TREC GB central register by sending a copy of the full vaccination record and horse registration details from the passport to admin@trecgb.com. Alternatively, your horse will be registered by the Entries Secretary for this event, please include a copy of the vaccination certificate and horse registration details when sending your completed entry in. **For more information, please visit the TREC GB website: www.trecgb.com**

Health and Safety

The event organiser will take all reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present.

For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and must obey the instructions of officials and stewards on the day.

Trained First Aiders will be present at the event and should be summoned through an official in the event of an accident.

The organiser will provide a contact telephone number for emergency veterinary cover.

Competitors are asked to safeguard valuable tack and possessions.

Young children must be supervised at all times.

Neither the event organiser nor the land owners can accept responsibility for loss or injury to persons or animals howsoever caused.

Horses must be a minimum of four years old (i.e. born in 2019 or earlier) to take part.

Mares more than four months pregnant may not take part.

TREC GB regards the welfare of participating horses as paramount. No horse may take part if it is unsound or unfit to carry the rider for any reason. Any rider who continues on a horse that they know to be unsound or that has been stopped by a veterinary surgeon or designated competent official on fitness and/ or welfare grounds will be eliminated from the ride.

Clearly visible coloured tail wraps/ribbons should be worn to advise other riders of a potential hazard – Red = kicker; Green = young/inexperienced horse; Blue = stallion.

If the horse/pony is a stallion then stallion discs must also be worn on both sides of the bridle.

Riders aged less than 14 years old on 30th April may only ride in a Pair with a rider of **18 years or older**. Parents/guardians of competitors under the age of 18 on 30 April 2023 will be required to complete a Parental Consent Form (available on the Wessex TREC website)

All riders taking part must be members of either Wessex TREC Club or a club affiliated to TREC GB or a TREC GB Red member.

Required Equipment; please see also Appendix 3 of the current TREC GB Rulebook

Tack and equipment will be checked.

The rider's hat must conform to one or more of the following standards.

- PAS 015 (2011) provided it has a BSI Kitemark OR an Inspec IC Mark VG1 01.040 (2014-12) provided it has a BSI Kitemark OR an Inspec IC Mark
- ASTM F1163 (2004a or 04a onwards), providing it has an SEI mark
- SNELL E2016, providing it has a SNELL label and number
- AS/NZS 3838 (2006 onwards), providing it has an SAI Global mark
- A hat camera **may not be worn** on the hat when mounted.
